- ✚ Darla Nicholl explained her plan for the soup suppers for the Lenten Season as well as Women's Ministry activities.
- ✚ Garrett McFaul described numerous youth activities from handing out T-shirts to car washes to making "Video Ministries."
- ✚ Jack Schlinsog highlighted the great work the Outreach Ministry is providing.
- ✚ Gregg Leonard and Don Wilson explained how we will assist in building a Habitat for Humanity home for a new neighbor in Huntington Beach.
- ✚ On behalf of the Preschool, Pastor Paul noted that enrollment was up.

I pray that as Council Chair I can continue to diligently oversee the financial and administrative aspects of operating our church. This will free the way for the Council and the congregation to focus on our Ministries which are the true "business" of our church.

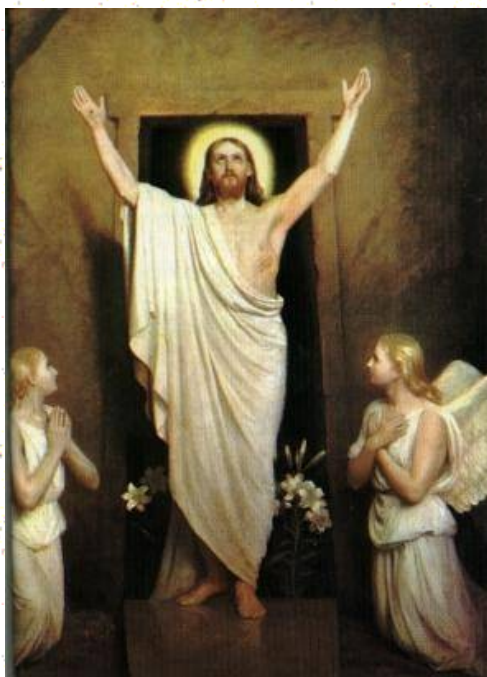

Thrivent Reports

* On December 31, 2009 Thrivent Financial ended the **Care in Congregations** program which provided a yearly fixed monetary amount, usually approximately \$1000, to every eligible Lutheran congregation. It was replaced by Choice Dollars, a program which allows Thrivent members to direct certain Thrivent provided dollars to the eligible Lutheran organization of their choosing. The number of dollars is dependent on their ownership of Thrivent fraternal products. Faith Lutheran Church and our Preschool are both eligible for these funds. I am happy to report that our congregation and preschool have received a total of \$2,356 as of this date.

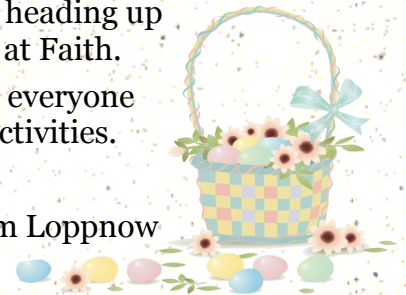
We deeply appreciate everyone who participated in this program. We would like to remind everyone that if you split your Choice Dollars between two or more organizations, you will have to periodically direct them. They will only allow you to direct them on a recurring basis if you select a single organization.

* Thrivent also supported several of our community outreach projects here at Faith through the locally managed **Care in Communities** program. We received a total of \$2,900 through this program which supports and encourages members to volunteer their time within the community.

* This year, we are being blessed with another opportunity to volunteer within the community through the **Thrivent Builds** program in support of Habitat For Humanity. One of this year's Orange County builds is right in our very own neighborhood. You can volunteer in many ways. Greg Leonard is heading up our participation here at Faith.

I will continue to keep everyone up-to-date on future activities.

Community Services Programs:

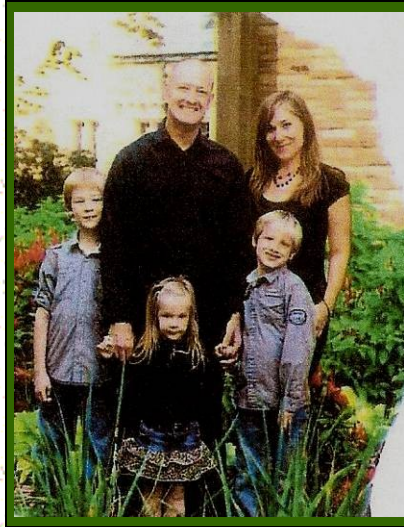

Jun Ordained to Ministry

Faith calls Mission Planter Jun

A special Call meeting was held at Faith, Sunday, January 30, to extend a call to Pastor Chimin Jun, as a church planter. Jun will begin his ministry to second-generation Koreans in the Corona del Mar area. In cooperation with the Pacific Southwest District of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS), Faith agreed to be the congregation extending the call in order that Jun might be ordained and begin his ministry.

"What does this mean for us?" said Pastor Paul. "It means that we are now involved in the planting of a new congregation in a very important mission field. Second, it will be our responsibility to pray for Pastor Jun and to lend him the spiritual support of God's people as he begins this difficult and exciting task."

What is ordination?

Ordination is the process by which individuals are consecrated, that is, set apart as clergy to perform various religious rites and ceremonies.

How do Lutherans define the word Call?

The Call (is the) invitation from God through the church to specific ministry in the church. *(1 Peter 5 :2) Be shepherds of God's flock that is under your care, serving as overseers—not because you must, but because you are willing as God wants you to be ... being examples to the flock. - Lutheran Encyclopedia*

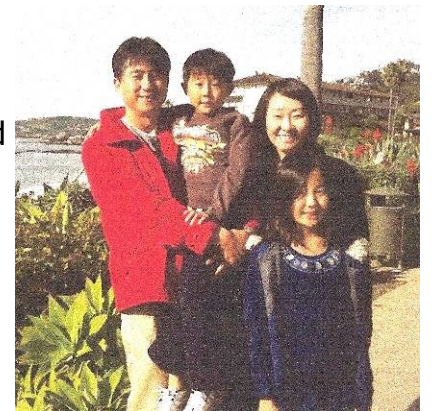


The worship—and Korean fellowship dinner following—was celebrated by Faith members, friends, and representatives of local LCMS Korean congregations.

Including members of the Japanese Lutheran Church and the Japanese Evangelical Lutheran Church, there are some 30,000 Lutheran in Japan. There is also the Japan Lutheran College and Japan Lutheran Theological Seminary in Tokyo.

The LCMS began work in Japan in 1948. In 1968, the Japan Lutheran Church became a self-governing body, and in 1976 a sister/partner church of the Synod. Today, LCMS missionaries continue to support the work of the Japan Lutheran Church in the areas of Lutheran education and theological training.

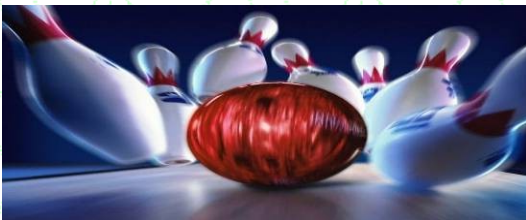
